Clinical Consults

- Provides over 2,500 clinical consults each year
- Pharmacists provide counseling for specialty medications, new prescription starts, smoking cessation, diabetes care, and hypertension management

Meds-to-Beds Program

Cabell Huntington Hospital

- Services all floors in Cabell Huntington Hospital except for the ICU and ED
- Averages 425 prescriptions per week
- Current capture rate is ~60% of all discharges receive this service

St. Mary's Medical Center

- Services M/S1, MCU, Oncology, Neurology, Telemetry, Pulmonary, Cardiac Step-Down, and Joint Center
- New service that is continually growing- program will be rolled out to other units
- Current capture rate is ~50% of all discharges

Prior Authorizations

Greater than 1,500 completed each year

- 88.6% were approved with first response and 93.5% eventually approved
- Median time to first response was 0 business days, regardless of clinic
 - In 75% of cases, first response was within 1 business day

Prescription Assistance Program

- Cabell Huntington Hospital program that provides assistance to patients with and without prescription insurance coverage
- Approximately 1,800-2,000 patients enrolled currently
- Without this program a substantial number of patients would go without necessary medications
- Patients are able to pick up their medications as they leave their appointments or the medications can be shipped to their home
